Natural Born Capitalist

Don Lager refers to himself as a "Natural Born Capitalist", and he isn't wrong. A man who has grown a family business that started in the 50's, Don is a man who has a passion for retail sales, not to mention motorcycles, fly-fishing and traveling.

In 1951 Don's father moved the family from Montana to Victorville. Now, Victorville in the 50's was much different than what it is today. The first family run business was a hardware and appliance store at George Air Force Base, where they specialized in Government contracts.

When the contracts went away the family opened business on Midway Street in 1959. Business was good and in 1961 opened their first store front in Victorville. Back in those days, Don and his brother used to be taken up to the dump to climb down and strip washers and dryers for parts, that the family would use to fix washers and dryers for their customers. Times were tough back then. There were only about 7,000 people living in Victorville and Apple Valley was just getting started, with its only access, a two lane road.

But with hard work, and dedication they outgrew that location in the early 60's and moved into the (then thriving) Victorville Shopping Center. Even their new location was too small to handle the demand of High Desert residents, but luckily in those days you could leave your doors unlocked and actually leave the merchandise outside without fear of theft.

In the 70's business was booming. By this time Don had purchased the company from his father and started to add more and more items to Midway. Finally in 2003 they moved into the old K-Mart in Victorville and now have a 24,000 sq. ft. showroom and a 40,000 sq. ft. inventory facility, all in one location.

Any resident who claims to call the High Desert their home, knows the name Midway Home Solutions. In this writer's home, all appliances, couches, major electronics, and master bedroom furniture have all been purchased at
