THE FUTURE OF THE JOSHUA TREE

Starting off 2021 right, the Club heard from our own **Robert Lovingood**, President of ICR Staffing in Victorville and former 1st District Supervisor. Robert took some time to explain some incredible new law changes for Covid employees and the future of Joshua Trees in the High Desert.

Taken from the National Law Review: On September 22, 2020, the California Fish and Game Commission (CFGC) accepted the Center for Biological Diversity's petition to list the Western Joshua Tree (WJT) as a candidate threatened species under the California Endangered Species Act (CESA). While offering at least interim protection to this iconic plant, this action will likely further complicate

the entitlement process for development projects and may affect other landowner activities within the WJT's habitat (which includes millions of acres in Southern California).

What this issue does is affect any county, city and person who want to move a Joshua Tree from any development area, including

your home. What once costed around \$400 will now cost someone around \$60,000! This impacts all industries, with the exception of Renewable Energy, which a proponent for it is on the CFGC Board.

More locally, Robert shared that the demand from employers is at an all time high, which is great for ICR Staffing. Robert also asked Rotarians to practice common sense and practice proper guidelines, knowing firsthand that Covid is real!

Asked what the next chapter of Robert Lovingood will be are now that he has served his last few years as 1st District Supervisor. Robert shared that he will continue to grow ICR Staffing and focus on mentoring others and continuing his non-profit work.
