B.E. F.A.S.T. to Save a Life

Donna Nash, RN, is the Director of Cardiovascular Services at St. Mary Medical Center. The number one killer in women today is heart disease. 1 in 3 women will suffer from it, due to their body makeup. In both male and females, heart disease is mainly caused by inactivity. In this day and age of people getting most of their entertainment and enjoyment from sitting on their couch, heart issues are becoming more rampant. Other risk factors stem from smoking, elevated cholesterol, hypertension, obesity and diabetes.

The most common cause of hospitalization in the US today is heart failure. Over 5 million Americans suffer from it. It is caused by the heart being damaged and it's inability to efficiently pump out oxygenated blood with each beat. Some reasons for heart failure include Coronary Artery Disease, a previous heart attack, high blood pressure and heart valve disease.

Symptoms of heart disease include shortness of breath, swelling of the feet and legs, lack of energy, difficulty sleeping at night due to breathing problems, a swollen or tender abdomen, loss of appetite, a cough with "frothy" sputum, increased urination at night and confused, impaired memory.

Donna Nash, an experienced RN, encourages all Rotarians to "B.E. F.A.S.T." You can help save a life if you are always on the lookout for people with the following symptoms: Balance issues, Eyes blurry, Facial droop, Arm,/leg weakness/numbness, Speech problems, and Time, call 911 immediately.

Through a variety of cardiac issues such as Vascular Disease, Angioplasty and Stenting, Arrhythmias, Stroke, Pacemakers, Defibrillators, and their *Mended Hearts* program, St. Mary Medical Center, serves its community well.
