WYOMING FELLOWSHIP OPPORTUNITY

Far away from sunny California, there lies Sheridan, Wyoming. The local Rotary Club, holds an annual event called "Gunpowder & Buckskin", geared for Rotary members who are hunters and fishermen. Members of that Club, Terry Weitzel and Gary Dobney (former member of our Club), host this event and each year are given six non-resident deer hunting licenses and use those to invite Rotary Club members from across the country to join them for 4 days of food, fun and hunting. This year they are offering

those licenses to members of the Rotary Club of Victorville

before anyone else.



The event is held from Thursday, October 7 - Sunday, October 10, and begins with a lot of wining and dining at their icebreaker mixer on the first night.

On Friday morning they begin with a prairie dog shoot at a local ranch. At this event you can use their firearms, and Terry will even let you use his AK47. According

to him, prairie dogs can be very destructive, making holes in the ground that horses and cattle can step into and break their legs. After that all will travel to a Sportsman Club to have their guns checked for accuracy so the killing of deer is quick with one shot and limited suffering of the animal. Following that, everything is tested with a Trap Shoot that is very fun, but can become very competitive between participants. Friday will conclude with a wonderful dinner under the

stars at a

local ranch.

Saturday is the Big Hunt and killing of Mule Deer Bucks. There is hunting for all levels and your guide will assist you along the way. After hunting concludes, your kill will be taken to a place called Valley



Meats to be weighed. At the evening banquet there are prizes for biggest and smallest deer and a lot of betting goes on at the dinner to see who will win biggest deer award.

On Sunday, the event concludes with some Fly Fishing on Big Horn River in Montana, which is only a 90 minute drive from Sheridan. Depending where they fish, either on the river or up in the mountains, it is mostly catch and release. When you depart you, can either arrange to have the deer meat from your hunting sent to you, or donate it to a local charity.

The cost for any Rotary Club of Victorville members who would like to participate includes airfare, hunting and fishing licenses


