Finemaster: Jim Barnes Health First Aid Responders, to be able to see the ever present signs of depression and anxiety, the leading causes of suicide.

Mental Health starts with the person wanting to help somebody else. They need to be of a sound mind and what happens in Dr. Etheridge's eight hour intensive course is that sometimes the person finds out that they themselves have issues that need to be worked out first. She takes her courses very seriously and doesn't play games because lives are at stake. In this intensive training they deal with everything imaginable because kids today don't know how to deal with the stress and depression so they turn to drugs, sex, cutting and suicide.

Through her training she is able to educate and train and send out people to go where others don't want to go to help others who are on the verge of suicide, especially young people, which is her main passion. Sadly, sometimes those places are right in our own homes, with our own children or grandchildren. Her biggest advice is to make sure that we make time for our kids and grandkids! Those who suffer from severe depression or anxiety are that way because they feel like the adults in their life won't listen to them or will be mad if they tell them how they feel.

In the workplace as well as in the home, some of the signs to look out for include isolation, a change in eating habits, lack of joy, change in tone of voice, clothes unkempt, missing work deadlines or late or leaving early from the office.




