CROSSING THE BRIDGE TO VICTORVILLE'S FUTURE

The Rotary Club received a visit this week from City of Victorville Public Information Officer **Sue Jones**, who gave us an update from the City and what to expect in 2023. Sue has served as the PIO for Victorville for seven years but moved to the High Desert in 2002 and fell in love with the area.

In the new year, Victorville's strategic priorities will continue to improve financial stability, a strong focus on

public safety, reduce homelessness and community & economic development. They will continue to invest in infrastructure, improved communication & outreach, plus continued organizational effectiveness.



In the Summer of 2023, residents should see the completion of the 600ft Bridge that will connect Victorville to Apple Valley, and

reduce congestion on Bear Valley Road and Highway 18. The bridge is completed, as is the roadway at Green Tree and Hesperia Road. The rest of the work will be on the east side of the Bridge, connecting it to Ridgecrest Blvd/Yucca Loma.

Also due by summer will be the conclusion of the Bear Valley Bridge Widening Project. The completed work will provide better sight distance, plus

two left hand turn lanes from eastbound Bear Valley Road onto Ridgecrest.

To help reduce homelessness, a Wellness Center is currently under construction which will not only house those in need, but also offer medical and mental health assistance. It will be a modular design, which means it will have 110 units and 170 beds, so each resident will have their own room. It is currently being built on city owned land on First Street. The Wellness Center will be a 56% increase in homeless shelter beds once opened.

In the area of public safety, Victorville has recently hired eleven new personnel, five compliance officers, and opened new Fire Station 315. Next on the agenda is a new police station which will be built on Civic Drive, across from the Courthouse.

Businesses in the city of Victorville will continue to grow. Last year they approved 200 commercial business licenses and 69 retail business licenses. This year residents will see CarMax, Superior Grocery, Dollar Tree and two hotels open up.
