

The Winningest Team in Junior College Football - VVC Rams - 2014

For the first time in their school history, Victor Valley College finished with a 10-0 perfect season. Says Coach Dave Hoover, "I think we proved this year that we are a top ranked junior college football program, going 10-0 and winning the American mountain Conference Championship."

When Dave Hoover was announced as the new Head Football Coach at Victor Valley College in 2000, the football program entered an era of unprecedented success. Coach Hoover has become the all-time wins leader, and virtually every school record holder has come in his tenure. He has guided the Rams to the first two bowl games in school history, and possesses the best single season record (9-1) of all-time Rams football teams. Four athletes have reached All-American status under coach Hoover, and twelve have made the All-State team.

Coach Hoover thrives under stress. He was asked Tuesday morning if he could fill in at the Rotary meeting for the scheduled speaker due to illness, and Dave attacked the mission as if it were his opposing team. For those who missed it, Dave's enthusiasm for his college team is contagious, and it's obvious he loves his job. He shared some great stories about achievements made by the kids he coaches, and says he has been blessed to have been associated with some incredible young men. Coach Dave's objective, aside from winning games, is to impact a kid's life, and his stories support that fact. It is so appropriate that Coach Hoover spoke to Rotary during Super Bowl week, and we thank him for answering Ginger's "Hail Mary" play.

Four hints were given about one of our Rotarians, and one of these is a lie. This one didn't take long to figure out, and I think was won with a correct guess.


