A "Married" Roman Catholic Priest Shares His Story



Father John Congdon, Priest Chaplain

It's not every day we meet a Roman Catholic Priest who is married. Rotary's guest speaker, Father John Congdon of the Fresno Catholic Diocese, has been on loan to St. Mary's as a Priest Chaplain. He was retired in 2010 from Ft. Irwin and married since 1969 to his "saintly" wife. He has been in the priesthood for 32 years.

Father John explained to Rotary's enquiring minds the many ramifications of being a married Priest, and answered pertinent questions. He began his career as a (married) Episcopal Priest, and explained how he and his wife converted to the Catholic Church and then he petitioned the Vatican in Rome for "reunion", which allowed his ordainment (considered case-by-case) in August of 2000.

We learned that upon completion of Seminary, the young man elects either "celibacy" or "marriage". The "gift" of celibacy is the normal choice; however, if one chooses marriage, he must marry prior to being ordained in the Church. We enjoyed learning about this unusual exception to the rule of the Catholic Church.


won uncontested (unless you saw Mark Sawyer

RI President-elect Gary C.K. Huang chose "Light Up Rotary" as his theme for 2014-15. Huang was inspired by the teachings of Chinese philosopher, Confucius, who said: "It is better to light a single candle, than to sit and curse the darkness."

"There are so many problems in the world, so many people who need help. Many people say, 'There's nothing I can do.' So they sit there doing nothing. Meanwhile everything stays dark," Huang told the 537 district governors and their spouses and partners who are attending the 2014 International Assembly in San Diego, California.

"The Rotary way is the Confucius way. The Rotary way is to light a candle. I light one, you light one, 1.2 million Rotarians light one. Together, we light up the world," said Huang, who is a member of the Rotary Club of Taipei in Taiwan.
