THE DOWNFALL OF NEWSPAPER JOURNALISM

This week the Club heard from Victor Valley Union High School District Public Engagement Information Manager **Kris Reilly** about his career, most notably as a journalist for many years before coming to the VVUSHD.

Arriving in High Desert in 1985, Kris used to read the Daily Press sports page growing up in Apple Valley. Over sports, music was a greater passion and Kris played in a local band and had dreams of "making it".

Like many others, rock stardom was not

in the cards, so Kris went back to school and studied journalism. Funny enough, his first job was writing for the Daily Press sports page! Back in those days he would have to take all the stats, plus interviews with coaches and players, making it interesting and have it written within one hour! At first he was not particularly good at it, but he continued to improve and led him to become the paper's Sports Editor.

After this time Kris went to work as Editor for the Lucerne Valley Leader, and in his first few months he was the most liked person in Lucerne Valley, and after that, the least liked person in the area!

In 2013, he came back to the Daily Press as the City Editor which basically meant he was the boss of all the reporters. After a total of

13 years, Kris finally left the paper as he saw the writing on the wall and where the newspaper industry was headed.

He was glad he got out when he did, as journalism has greatly changed since his heyday. Back then a reporter would have daily deadlines and the norm was on average, seven stories a day! But in 2010, social media made news more immediate, and many papers went online. The challenge with that was the loss of print ad revenue. Print ads is

where papers make their money, and the industry has monetized digital ads over print ads, which hurts the newspaper's bottom line.

Unless newspaper reporters have a great passion for journalism, many don't last long in the industry. When Kris began his career in 2003 he was making \$12 per hour and in 2013 when he became City editor, some of the Daily Press reporters were still only making \$12 per hour! As is common knowledge today, the once bustling Daily Press office is now almost a ghost town, with only a few people running the paper locally. The saddest part is, according to Kris is the paper now suffers a deficit of coverage of many local news items that matter to the community. Other local online-only papers such as HDdailynews.com still cover local news, and VVNG. com has its focus on the "if it bleeds, it leads" type of journalism.

Finally, back in the day, the Daily Press clearly separated the difference between news, opinion and advertisement, clearly marked in different sections. Nowadays throughout all media types, the lines are blurred, with ads as well as opinion pieces presented as news. Local news seems to be mostly geared to entertain, over to inform the reader. Kris states the best place to find unbiased *Continued on page 2*


