How to Prepare for El Niño

WHEN

DON'T

DROWN

As you can see from our recent storms, El Niño is here and is forecast to make guite an impact in our High Desert. Dana Welbourn, Emergency Manager with the City of Victorville shared a lot of information on not only what an El Niño is, but how we can prepare ourselves.

El Niño is the most powerful climate force on Earth. It is caused by complex weather patterns resulting from variations in ocean temperatures in the Equatorial Pacific waters. It is not a large storm, typhoon or a hurricane, but brings extra moisture to existing storms. In our area, the desert soil can't absorb much water, so that extra moisture in the rains bring on floods and mud slides.

There are ways to protect your home and your family. Check your storm drains and make sure they are cleared of all obstructions. Inspect your roof, or hire a roofing contractor to inspect for loose tiles, holes or other signs of trouble. If you have a retaining wall at your home, inspect for any wall or surface drains.

Having sandbags on hand is another great way to prepare your home. Sandbags can be stacked to keep water from flooding low areas. They can also be used for slope areas around your home to prevent water from eroding the dirt

away. If you are in need of sandbags, please visit any of your local fire stations, they have them on hand ready to give you.

In case there is a flood issue, please be prepared. Make sure you have proper flood insurance, important financial papers, prescriptions and any personal items needed in case you and your family need to evacuate your home. Make sure you have a safety kit prepared in a safe place containing drinking water, canned food, first-aid, **FLOODED** blankets, a radio and flashlight.

TURN AROUND come across any flooded area, please remember to "Turn Around, Don't Drown" Over half of all flood-related drownings occur when a vehicle is driven into hazardous flood water. People underestimate the force and power of water. Many of the deaths occur in automobiles as they are swept downstream. Of these drownings, many are preventable, but too many people continue to drive around the

If you find yourself on the road and you

barriers that warn you the road is flooded. A mere 6 inches of fast-moving flood water can knock over an adult. It takes just

12 inches of rushing water to carry away a small car, while 2 feet of rushing water can carry away most vehicles. It is NEVER safe to drive or walk into flood waters.
