

INNOVATIVE & PROACTIVE CURE FOR HOMELESSNESS

The facts are in, according to Cassandra Searcy, the Homeless Solutions Coordinator with the City of Victorville... we are the 2nd highest concentration of homeless in California for the last two years! While you are processing that, there is also the political aspect of it all. In year's past, the Federal and State governments worked on the homeless issue, but now cities are being pushed to the forefront to deal with it and they are ill equipped to do so. Now, any city that is seen as not offering alternatives to this crisis is being sued!



Victorville is not wanting to be put in that situation, so Cassandra and her staff were hired to make proactive changes, as she shared with the Club this week. One year ago, the City of Victorville created the Homeless Task Force and began plans for the Homeless Wellness Center, which will have separate sleeping quarters for men and women who are single, plus pet kennels for those with animals. Basic needs will be met, such as meals, transportation assistance, laundry facilities, mailboxes, and assistance in locating stable housing. There

will also be education in life skills and individual needs addressed, providing a sense of purpose and direction.

Connected to the Wellness Center will be Recuperate Care, as a place for homeless to recuperate after hospitalization to improve health outcomes. As anyone can attest, emergency rooms are overcrowded and expensive. In fact, for some people, one ER visit is equivalent to one year's rent! This new care system will help alleviate the

traffic in our area's emergency rooms.

Innovation is needed to make this project a reality, so Cassandra and the task force are looking into modular construction. Modular construction is a process in which a building is constructed off-site, under controlled plant conditions, using the same materials and designed to the same codes and standards as conventionally built facilities – but in about half the time. This will allow the facility to be in operation much sooner than normal foundation building. To accomplished their vision, they are currently looking into building a 17,000 sq. ft. facility to house both centers. If proven successful, this could also allow for more affordable housing development for more than just the homeless, but for seniors and those on very low income as well, who spend almost 30% of their total year's income on rent.

To get involved or have your voice heard, the Homeless Task Force holds a meeting at City Hall every 2nd Tuesday at 4:00pm.
