BECAUSE IT HAPPENS IN A HEARTBEAT

Bud Green wants heart healthy kids. Studies show that Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA) is the number 2 cause of death in youth under the age of 25 and is the number 1 killer in student athletes. There are many overwhelming and unnecessary deaths caused annually by SCA and heart conditions that come about with no recognizable warning signs, but could be detected with a heart screening. The Ronald Reagan UCLA Medical Center, Scripps Institute in San Diego and the Eric Paredes Save a Life Foundation are three leading



organizations providing heart screenings to their perspective areas at no cost, but this is sadly missing from San Bernardino County and the High Desert. Bud Green has a dream to make this available to all youth, regardless of location.

All kids go to the doctor, but child athletes get the most robust physicals due to playing sports. All over the state of California, children pass away sometimes at home, but also sometimes in the middle of sporting events at local middle, high schools and junior colleges. The best way to stop this is the use of Echocardiograms and EKG's. An Echocardiogram is basically a sonogram for the heart, and can do wonders in detecting heart problems, but is very expensive.

Bud is visiting organizations throughout the County looking for contacts in our local schools and medical professionals to try and get assistance for volunteers and support for his mobile heart service unit. Right now Bud is grateful for volunteer professionals from Orange County who assist him with these screenings, but needs local medical cardiologists to volunteer. As well, he needs support from schools and parents, to help all kids 5 to 24 years old and especially student athletes, where the dangers of SCA is most prevalent. Let's not wait until it happens during a school basketball game to make a change, Bud Green wants to do preventative medicine.

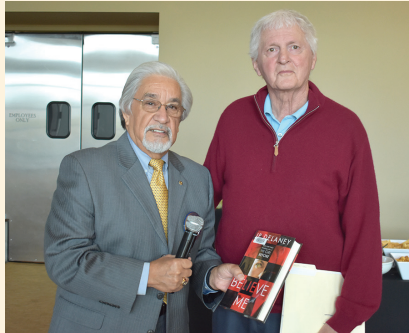
