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reason for failure is an poor infrastructure. Lack of proper systems and processes handle the increased complexity in running successful business. Finally there is the issue of marketing, failing to address the changing market needs and/or to attract enough of the right customers.

The framework for

sustainable success lies in four key areas; people, strategy, execution and cash. In the area of people, business owners need to ask themselves, would I enthusiastically rehire everyone on the team? Business leaders need to do whatever is necessary to have the best team of people. Businesses can get the best team through proper assessment, acquisitions, successful on-boarding experiences, employee development and retaining staff by having them buy into the mission of the company, not just work for a paycheck.

Strategy is the next area to look into. Would anyone care if your business ceased to exist tomorrow? Any successful business has a strategy to make them irreplaceable in the eyes of their customers. The core purpose of your business must be succinct. You need to firmly know what your cause and purpose is for being in business, the specific actions one needs to take to bring the purpose to fruition and do find what is the end result of your purpose for running your company. Some great examples shared included 3M (To Solve unsolved problems innovatively), Merrick (To preserve and improve human life), and Disneyland (To make people happy).

What is business success anyway? Business success is when a company positively impacts employees, customers, stakeholders and the community. Success also means the business consistently generates profitable growth while creating high valuation and can run smoothly without much drama. A successful business provides the owner the ability to sell the company at a higher value, continue to run it at a profit while having more time and less anxiety, or use the business as a platform to open up smaller business around the main company.

Businesses struggle and fail over three main reasons. The first is leadership. If there is an inability to develop & staff enough leaders who have the ability to delegate and predict, it will hurt the company. Another

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The next area of success is execution. How many months in a row have you reached or exceeded your business goals? Make sure the goal is known by everyone in the company, and why it is important for everyone to contribute. Everyone should know what the goal is, why the company is doing it, when it will be completed and the person who will coordinate it. The main takeaway is to communicate successfully with your staff.

The final framework for success is cash. Are you pushing and pulling on the right profit levers for your company? Successful business leaders embrace 10% as the new break even mark. The ultimate goal is to make your company worth as much as possible. Ways to do that include revenue growth, a great management team of other leaders, recurring revenue with a focus on returning clients and market growth.
