## **Perspectives on the Rotary 4-Way Test**







Three high school students came well prepared to participate in the Club level Annual 4-Way Speech Contest. Each brought a unique viewpoint to their interpretation of the Rotary Theme, "Light

Up Rotary" and how it relates to the Rotary 4-Way Test. Three high schools were represented. Nicole Ratliff of University Prep highlighted her speech with a brief musical portion, and an off repeated phrase in her speech was, "When they needed my help, was I there?" Victor Valley High School student Anthony Aponte spoke about the importance of the willingness of all people to work in harmony toward peace. Silverado student Hannah Schroeder's winning speech revolved around how she uses her strong Christian religion to "light up my surroundings to make the world a better place". The theme "Light Up Rotary" was resonant within each speech, and included quotations from Confucius, Roman Catholic Priest James Keller, and the Holy Bible.

First, second and third place winners each took home Target Gift Cards valued at \$125, \$100, and \$75. Ms. Schroeder will continue on to the regional level, and culminating in a District final conducted at the District Governor's Conference. Bring a Visitor to a Club Meeting 5 pts. one time for each new visitor	5




## Russ' Rap
