ROTARY GETS HISTORY LESSON AND GIVES STUDENT S.T.A.R. AWARDS



Former City Manager Jim Cox offered his explanation to the Rotary Club of Victorville as to why our High Desert communities failed in their attempt to form a separate county.

In 1986 several High Desert citizens attempted to form the Mojave County, which would encompass 18,000 square miles, and of those, 13,000 acres were government-owned land. A Mojave County Committee was formed. Over 20,000 signatures were acquired and 23 public hearings were held. There was much opposition by the County, and committee members were attacked regularly at these hearings.

Jim stated these were very interesting times; the public was convinced by the county that costs would be excessive, and the final result was that the county would be losing significant tax dollars if a separate county was formed.

In 1988 the court ruled against the new county, and San Bernardino County continues to receive a huge percentage of monies generated in the High Desert.

The Rotary Club of Victorville's S.T.A.R. Awards recognize those students who have made a significant improvement in their G.P.A., Attitude, or Attendance. This week five students received the recognition. They represented Mountain View Montessori Charter School, Village Elementary School, Green Tree East Elementary School, Lomitas Elementary School, and Liberty Elementary School. President Charles Gehrke presented the awards along with Rotarian and Victor Elementary School District Superintendent, Dale Marsden.


