HELPING SENIORS BECOME AGE WISE

This week we were joined by Lisseth Tupe and Estela Silva from the San Bernardino County Department of Aging and Adult Services who shared innovative approaches caring for our Senior Citizens with their non traditional Age Wise program.

Older adults face multiple challenges such as physical, relational,

moderate mental illness are linked to other appropriate services.

financial. emotional losses in their lives, which can result in serious behavioral health problems and can lead to impairments in activities of daily living. Multiple losses demand multiple service needs, such as food, financial assistance, health advocacy, legal aid, recreational/social therapy, housing, or hospice care that need to be coordinated for the welfare of the person. There is also the seriousness of mental illness from isolation, co-morbid disorders (medical, mental, or substance abuse), experiencing complicated grief and loss issues, or have been a victim of abuse, exploitation, scams, identity theft. In the Age Wise program, if an individual is assessed to have severe mental illness, they will provide therapeutic services. Those assessed with mild or



For these circumstances, plus others not noted above, it shows just how important a program like Age Wise truly is. Age Wise is a non-traditional mental health program for the high-risk and under-served older adult population. Services are provided throughout the County of San Bernardino to older adults who would benefit from behavioral health

and wellness services and who may be seeking assistance connecting to resources to help meet basic needs. The Age Wise program includes a team of staff with diverse health and wellness specialties and utilizes a multidisciplinary approach, including collaboration with other agencies serving older adults.



Services include field based in-home therapy and case management, which allows older adults to be able to access needed care. Telehealth is now an option that enables Age Wise staff to reach clients during COVID 19 restrictions, as well as

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
those who live in remote areas even after the restrictions are lifted. Besides offering behavioral health and wellness therapy, they also assist seniors with intensive case management, locating and connecting to resources, completing forms and applications plus addressing the stigma of participating in the behavioral health and wellness system.

The program is eligible for seniors 59 years or older and receives or qualifies for Medi-Cal. Those who qualify are highly encouraged to reach out to Age Wise if they are feeling isolated, have, or are feeling like they may have a behavioral health condition, currently working through family or relational concerns, had a recent behavioral health hospitalization, or are experiencing thoughts or behaviors which negatively impact daily functioning.

Currently about 76% of the participants in the program are female according to county statistics. Locally in Hesperia, the percentage is around 64%.

Age Wise is a voluntary program. Potential clients have to be willing to participate in treatment. If you know a senior who can benefit from this program please call (800) 451-5633 and a representative will be in contact with them for a screening/assessment.
