S.B. County Sheriff's Department Aviation Division

Captain Sam Lucia introduced the San Bernardino Sheriff's Department Aviation Division's second-in-command, Lieutenant Mitch Dattilo, who brought us a great Power Point presentation. The division provides the following services: general law enforcement support, narcotics surveillance, personnel/cargo transport, airborne photography, search and rescue/recovery, multi-agency pursuit coordination, wild land fire suppression and emergency medical services transport. San Bernardino County is the largest county in the continental US at just over 20,000 square miles, and has huge variations in landscape ranging from desert to mountainous regions as high as 11,500 ft., making for some dangerous situations for a helicopter.

The division responds to approximately 250 calls for service each year in our county. These calls range from technical hoist rescues, swift water rescues, injured skiers/boarders/hikers, and major accident trauma victims. SBSD Aviation also responds to numerous special missions including: dive rescues, SWAT calls, marijuana extractions, etc. as well as approximately 80 brush and wildland fires each year. All helicopters are equipped with water dropping capability.

It is quite impressive that the department has close to 2100 volunteers serving in various capacities; more, in fact, than employees. These volunteers serve as Citizens on Patrol, Search and Rescue, and professionals (doctors, nurses, etc.) who donate their time and aircraft when necessary. Mitch's program was very fascinating, and we thank him for speaking to us about the Aviation Division and its intricacies.


