#### **VVC'S NEW EDUCATIONAL MASTER PLAN**

Even though Victor Valley College has been closed for just under a year, the future looks extremely bright for the campus, according to VVC Superintendent and President, **Dr. Daniel** Walden.

The challenging year for the College began on Dr. Walden's birthday, March 15th 2020, when the decision was made to close VVC and take all 1,100 classes online. Within 2 weeks the teachers were ready and classes resumed and their IT Department received two awards for managing the transition so successfully.

In November the College developed a new Education Master Plan. The old plan was about a decade old and severely outdated. They developed a new vision which states,

"Committed to equity and social justice, Victor Valley College will be the model of an innovative community college through exceptional student experiences that drive success, promote civic engagement, and meet community needs." As well, the new vision led to a new mission, "Victor Valley College, in partnership with the community, is dedicated to providing opportunities for student learning and success through academic advancement,

workforce development, and personal growth".

As a student-centered learning organization, the master plan will uphold the following core values:

- Excellence providing superior service and educational learning opportunities.
- · Integrity guiding the college's actions with an internally consistent framework of principles.
- · Accessibility facilitating access to the college's programs from other locations.
- · **Diversity** valuing inclusion and different points of view and contributions of all groups...
- · Collaboration encouraging recursive interaction of knowledge experience and mutual learning of people who are working

together toward a common creative goal.

· Innovation - providing creative approaches to learning, problem solving, and growth.

Over the next 5 years, VVC will focus on guiding the pathways of students, not just have them attend, and then leave once they complete their studies. The focus will be on the goals the student wants to reach to be a success even after graduation. Along with this is a new campaign of campus caring, between all 833 staff and faculty that will flow to their most important asset, their students. The thinking behind this is that a caring campus starts with caring for each other, and in the end, VVC students will know that they truly matter.

community come to fruition.


Bill Edwards shared with the Club this week that he is still going through our reserve of auction items and is looking into another online auction, and with any hope, a possible inperson fundraiser this September!

and achievement, transfer-level course completion, engagement, retention, persistence, graduation, transfer, and job placement for its graduates. VVC will champion an equity-minded frame that fosters responsible attitudes toward cultural diversity, personal responsibility, community engagement, inclusivity, and cultural humility.

The next goal focuses on High Quality Practice/Excellence. VVC will continue to develop and implement high-impact, student-centered practices, showcasing VVC's dynamic, diverse, and highly trained workforce, to promote equitable, innovative, and evidence-based best practices across all campus operations. VVC will continuously demonstrate the quality of its programs by conducting ongoing and systematic improvements using



research, assessment, and the professional expertise of its workforce members.

The third and final goal is in the area of Institutional Learning. VVC will transform its environment through its investments in a culture of

inquiry that emphasizes engaged and collaborative learning through action research. Such powerful scholarship across campus will inspire meaningful contributions to the workforce and local community to create world class innovative teaching and student service practices. In turn, VVC will empower a new generation of lifelong learners with multi-cultural and global competencies.

With the success of his Educational Master Plan Dr. Walden envisions that Victor Valley College will be recognized as one, if not the best college in the Country over the next decade! But first, the reopening must take place, and in their 4-phase plan, they are still in the first phase, where the campus is closed and all classes are online. Phase 2 (hopefully by April or May) will have the College reopen to the public, with classes remaining online. Soon after they hope to bring in Phase 3, which will include hybrid classes such as in-person labs and classes varying from half the class in person one day, then online the next, while the other half switches. Of course Phase 4, which they hope comes to fruition by the Fall, is the full reopening of Victor Valley College. Time will tell.
