and locally, only 16% leave high school college or career ready. This program will dramatically change that.

The Dual Enrollment Program brings college courses directly into the high schools. The benefits of this include the fact there is no transportation needed, and the classes, including textbooks, are free of charge. A student who participates will earn their high school diploma and gain college credits simultaneously as well as gain an early start to an Associates or Bachelors Degree. Another great aspect to the program is that it allows complete access to WC's campus services, including the library, math success labs and tutoring.

The Program allows the high schooler to explore various career opportunities before they even graduate high school as well as building their self confidence and creating the pathway to a career or future transfer to a 4 year college or University. The work ethic in high school and college are vastly different and this program will give students and early view, to be better prepared as they enter VVC full time after graduation.

Currently there are 600 students and only a handful of high schools taking part in this program, but Mark is meeting with schools on a constant basis to bring the participation numbers up with our local schools. Any student can do a concurrent enrollment while in high school with the college, but they have to get to the college and pay for the classes and textbooks themselves. This program provides all those costs at no charge, but the high school must participate in the program.
