If you make qualified energy efficient improvements to your home, you may qualify for a tax credit up to \$3,200. The credit equals 30% of qualified expenses.

If the IRS needs to contact you, they won't do it through text messages or email, those are frequent scams. Most contact will be first by mail and then phone calls.
