A VISIT FROM THE VVUHSD

This week the Rotary Club heard from **Carl Coles**, the new Superintendent from the Victor Valley Union High School District. He presented an update on the exciting things happening for students in the High Desert.

The District instructs middle and high school students from grades 7 - 12. Over 9 schools, the current enrollment is 11,000 students with 1,000 staff members. A whopping 84% are economically disadvantaged students, 12.7% are learning the English language and 14% are special education students.

VVUHSD is the region's first high school district, established in 1915. Its flagship school, Victor Valley High School, was the

area's only high school until 1967 when neighboring Apple Valley built its own (with other nearby cities later doing the same).

Today, VVUHSD has three comprehensive high schools (Adelanto, Silverado and Victor Valley high schools); two schools of choice (Cobalt Institute of Math and Science and University Preparatory School); one junior high (Hook Junior High School);

one grade 7-12 academy (Lakeview Leadership Academy); one virtual academy (Victor Valley Virtual Academy); and two alternative schools (Goodwill High School and Victor Valley Adult School).

Through all of this the VVUHSD is committed to preparing students for college and the workforce through rigorous curriculum and programs before, during, and after school. Their Heritage Program closes the achievement gap by increasing college readiness for African-American students.

The district has a long, rich history of championship athletics. Sports program are offered at all schools with the exception of continuation and virtual schools. All

programs are not sports based either. Each school has an average of 25 campus clubs, giving students the opportunity to explore their interests and interact with like-minded peers. Schools in the district also provide a variety of excellent visual and performing arts programs.

The district has accomplished goals in obtaining an 85% graduation rate and met the UC/CSU requirements of 38.5%. Carl ended his presentation by reminding Rotarians that the Victor Valley Union High School District is truly a place for everyone; a great place to learn and a great place to work.
