The Grim Reaper Walks into Hospice...

Mary Hennessy is a strong woman. Anyone who chooses to work in the Hospice industry needs to be. Gentiva Hospice provides comfort to your loved one, skilled care, and nursing visits. They even help your family with things like supplies, equipment and hospice medications. Spending your career working with people nearing the

end of their lives, needs a brave and compassionate person. Now that the California Death with Dignity Act is in place, it is now even closer.

The California Bill ABX2-15 was signed by Governor Jerry

Brown in October 2015.

The bill will go into effect 91 days after the close of a special session in November 2016 which means the bill should go into effect no later than February 2017.

The California Bill closely mirrors that of Oregon's Death with Dignity Act. In that one, a patient with a terminal disease who has been given a maximum of 6 months to live as determined by two separate physicians qualifies to end their life if they so choose. They must be a resident of Oregon, be of a sound mind, go through an extensive examination and must be able to swallow the medication or be able to push the contents of the pill through a feeding tube. The patient must make two separate verbal requests, 15 days apart, to a physician who then documents it in their medical record. After that there are written forms, overseen by two witnesses to go to the next phase. The cost to do this is expensive and is not one to be taken lightly. With a suicide, nothing is guaranteed. With Death with Dignity this method is. The medication used is a 100mg Secobarbital pill, that will put the patient to sleep within 4 minutes and end their life.

In California ABX2-15, the patient must be 18 years or older, have the capacity to make decisions, must have a terminal disease, be a resident of California and voluntarily express their need for the drug, without any influence from anyone else.

Due to a variety of reasons, Hospice cannot be involved in this process. They cannot make the order, be present in any way but can and encourage those patients to be on Hospice.

What Gentiva Hospice can do during this time is be a comfort for the family and handle all duties after the procedure has been done. Caring for a loved one can be very stressful.
