



Granite and Sugar Beets

Who would have thought the subjects of granite and limestone could be so interesting? Apparently, many Rotarians, as there wasn't an empty seat in the house. Our speaker, Fire Chief of the Apple Valley Fire Protection District, Sid Hulquist, has a passion for the history of our desert, and this excitement is contagious. His main point was to show "how important the mining industry was to the growth and sustainability of the communities we enjoy today". The photos below are taken directly from Sid's Power Point presentation, and represent his "amateur" fascination with our history. He is a superior photographer as well, and speaks with great enthusiasm about subjects such as granite, limestone, and our interesting past.

Most of the mines were established in the late 1800's and early 1900's, mining granite, limestone, silver and gold. Some uses for granite are building construction, road paving and curbs, shoring along the railroad, and monuments. Sid's slide depicting



the mining process read, "The granite lies in nearly horizontal beds from 6 to 15 feet thick. It is medium-grained and hard, and is broken down by hand drilling and blasting with black powder, and further split with plugs and feathers." Hard to imagine, but you can see in the photos below the enormity of the granite. Pictured in the center is the Ferry Building in San Francisco, built from "Victor Granite", which also built the San Bernardino County Jail in 1904.



How are Sugar Beets relative to Limestone?



Sid then introduced us to the process of refining sugar in the "old days"... American Beet Sugar Co. used Limestone in the processing of sugar beets. The Hoey and Superior Quarries were located east of Oro Grande. Limestone was shipped to factories in Oxnard & Chino mostly between 1891 and 1914. The company today is known as American Crystal Sugar Co. What might be next in Sid's history lesson to Rotary? Hopefully we won't have to wait too long to hear!
