Joe, a Polio survivor, shared that Oro Grande began 150 years ago as a gold and silver mining town, although the area was more rich in silver than gold. Joe has been a part of Oro Grande for 72 years, and shared many photos with Rotarians and guests. Growing up, the town was rich

oldest cemetery in San Bernardino County! The cement plant was begun by a woman named Mrs. Potts, who recognized the minerals in the area and went home to England to get funding to start the plant, which was originally called "Golden State Cement".

The population of Oro Grande has changed a lot over the years, from 3,000 during the Gold Rush to 600 nowadays, but that has not stopped them from celebrating their history with the free Oro Grande Days which will take place on April 7th and 8th featuring live music, a car show, cemetery tours, old west gun fights and much more. Join them in April to see the rich history for yourself.


