EDUCATION THROUGH DISTANCE LEARNING

This week we were S0 happy to have Jan Gonzales. Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent Maureen Mills from the Victor Elementary School District join the Club via Zoom, to share how VESD has adapted to distance learning and what is coming up in way of returning students back onto their campuses.



Since the current school year began in August 2020, there has been a 96% participation rate among students, and all of them, now including kindergarten and first graders, have Chromebooks as well as hot-spots devices, if needed, for learning. In addition, the schools are doing occasional home visits and distribute regularly textbooks that don't come in digital form and materials as needed.

There is also a community feeding program through VESD that serves breakfast and lunch to not only their students, but any child between the ages of 3 to 18 who qualifies. Since June 2020, they have served well over 1 million meals, and for those students who are handicapped or cannot make it to school, their meals are delivered to them.

Currently 80% of teachers are conducting their classes from home, while the remaining 20% teach from inside their classrooms. Each school day there is time of live interaction with students and daily instructional minutes are at least 180 minutes for kindergarten, 230 minutes for grades 1 to 3, and 240 instructional minutes for grades 4 to 12. Physical education

minutes have been waived though, due to school closures.

The future has all eyes on reopening and welcoming children back on campuses. The District has established a process for cleaning and sanitizing, and all employees must track symptoms at home before coming into work. Each site or department has established a single point of entry where employees must enter and have temperature and symptoms checked daily. As one can see, there is a standard operating procedure for everything they are doing.

On March 1st, all VESD schools began an after school tutoring program available for students falling behind on Mondays and Thursdays for 2 hours.

They plan to begin Phase One on April 5, when students return from Spring Break, allowing 25% of students each day return to school. The percentage of students allowed will increase as Covid cases lower. Each desk will have protective screens, as well as masks, hand sanitizers and other PPE equipment.

Thank you to both Jan and Maureen for all of the hard work you are doing to keep education alive for High Desert students, whether in person or at home.
