UPDATE & HISTORY OF ONTARIO AIRPORT

Things are soaring at the Ontario Airport. This week the Club heard from Community Engagement Specialist **Jennifer Contreras**, who shared that the Airport is currently celebrating it's Centennial Anniversary.

The Ontario Airport is the gateway for many Southern California popular destinations and takes about 15 minutes from curb to gate. For the last 5 years, Ontario Airport has been named

the fastest growing medium-sized airport in the country.

Ontario Airport currently hosts over 20 non-stop destinations and will include more beginning this summer. In June, Southwest Airlines will begin daily non-stop service to Nashville, as well as other destinations.

In additional to passenger airlines, Ontario Airport is also a cargo hub for UPS, FedEx and Amazon Prime. The airport is the most important e-commerce hub in the Western United States, with over 60,000 tons of air cargo, 2,661 tons of mail and 56,429 tons of air cargo.

A recent development that has brought a lot of excitement to the airport is the addition of the ONT+ Program. This program brings back the days of being able to see your loved ones to the airport departure gate and be there as soon as they arrive back. One must contact the airport at least 24 hours in advance to be cleared for this program.

Another new update to Ontario
Airport that excited many

Rotarians is the Global Entry Enrollment Program. With a cost of \$100 for five years, frequent travelers can bypass the TSA lines, not only at Ontario Airport but at many airports around the country.

Upcoming advancements include a short story dispenser, which will print out a short story for parents to read to little travelers, a new cargo hub, runway upgrades, new seating and charging stations, improved way finding signs and an increase number of security checkpoints in each terminal.

In the Ontario Airport terminals you may come across some four-legged friends too. Jennifer introduced the Paw Squad, a group of dogs that work the airport to calm jittery passengers. For those who need help in human form, the airport has Customer Experience Specialists, who can help passengers with their travel needs.

our Rotarians on a trip down memory lane of the Airport, and sharing the exciting new features now available and upcoming!


