TERRY CALDWELL EXPLAINS THE BEGINNINGS OF THE VVWRA

"It all started with the Sanitary District Act of 1923, and no, I was not a part of the creation of the old Victorville Sanitation District", began Terry Caldwell as he reminisced about the beginnings of his association with VVWRA (in 1968). Jim Cox was the new City Manager and persuaded Terry to run for his first elected office, which was with the Victorville Sanitation District.

Terry explained how sewage disposal worked for around 50 years. In the sixties, The EPA issued the "Clean Water Act", substantiating the need for a regional waste water treatment facility in the high desert. With Victorville's recent growth spurt, the sanitation issue had to be addressed, and the Victorville Sanitation District had the foresight and found the funding to build sewers in the city of Victorville. Hesperia and Apple Valley were unincorporated at the time, and ground water degradation wasn't a concern due to the large lot sizes of minimal growth in those cities.

Victorville's community leaders appointed a task force (Jim Cox, Bill Porter, Terry Caldwell, and others) to determine how to handle the discharge and where to site the facility. He explained how they

worked through several issues, and that the reclaimed water can be utilized in parks, medians, golf courses, etc. Terry expressed kudos to the late Bill Porter, then President of the Mojave Water Agency, for his part in obtaining grant money from the Clean Water Act to build the facility in Victorville. The formation of the Victor Valley Regional Waste Water Treatment Facility then followed, and the history continues today, albeit with some issues. Thanks, Terry, for the interesting walk through history and explaining the exhaustive process of forming an agency such as the VVWRA!


