Rotarian CPA's Share Enlightened Tax Knowledge

Victorville Rotarians made up an informative panel to answer tax questions from fellow Club members. Dan Dever was the official Moderator, and first asked for a moment of silence before "Talking Taxes". There were audience questions relating to the current high rate of foreclosures and short sales and how they affect taxing agencies and lenders. The answers were quite surprising! Reducing taxes was a popular subject, as was tax audits.

Donna Wells shared how a client can be a "professional gambler" and show a loss; John Hulterstrom stated that almost any tax question could be answered with the phrase "it depends"; and Jennifer Starbuck explained "suspended losses" on income property for landlords with income over a certain amount of "threshold" income.

Dan Dever gave us some history on how taxing citizens began in our country in 1913 and has it ever evolved. The IRS has this year added more than 4,000 Auditors! Dan's parting advice is that, "Tax laws change yearly... it is best to hire a professional!"




