

Congressman Paul Cook Shares His Political Viewpoints

Congressman Cook is well educated, holding two masters degrees; Political Science and Public Administration. He represents California's 8th Congressional District, which includes the high desert communities of San Bernardino County as well as Mono and Inyo counties. He currently serves on the House Armed Services, Foreign Affairs, and Veterans' Affairs committees.

Congressman Cook brings to his office a strong set of values and a willingness to work in a bipartisan manner on the issues he is passionate about. This week he shared some of these political views. He admits his dissatisfaction in how poorly so many aspects of big government are run, and plans to do his best to change what needs fixing. His biggest con-

cerns are foreign affairs, the budget, Medicare, energy, and stated that of course, Obamacare will also need a lot of attention going for-





Congressman Cook served as an infantry officer and retired after 26 years as a Colonel in the U.S. Marine Corps. During his time in combat, he was awarded the Bronze Star and two Purple Hearts, with "V" for valor. We can thank the Congressman for sponsoring H.R.1241: To facilitate a land exchange involving certain National Forest System lands in the Inyo National Forest, and for other purposes.
