Hensel Ethics Essay Contest is designed to challenge high school students to analyze ethical issues and concerns confronting them in today's complex world. Because our fellow Rotarian, businessman, and philanthropist, George R. Hensel, Ph.D., privately funded this contest before his death in 2012. Students submit essays to their local Rotary Clubs and present their essays at a club meeting. Winners at the club level advance to the District Level and four winners at that level are awarded monetary prizes. The overall winning essay is presented at the District Conference.

Out of hundreds of submissions and led by **Dr. Ron Boyd**, the top three essays were presented this week at the Club Level.
