TRAINING NOT FOR LICENSES, BUT FOR GREAT EMPLOYEES

There are many exciting and beneficial programs and classes that one can take at Victor Valley College through their Noncredit Program. Moreover, most of all it is free of charge! There are no fees or tuition, only licensing fees, depending on the course. **Richard Radcliffe**, VVC's Director of Noncredit Programs, Public Safety and Industrial Technology spoke to the Club about these different programs. He also talked about some



coming down the road, and ones that are now in session.

A non-credit instruction course includes an array of no-cost courses that help students reach their personal, academic, and professional goals. Courses offer academic enrichment, where students can take part in extracurricular classes and receive advanced instruction or discover new hobbies, interests, and activities outside of the classroom setting. Courses also prepare students for employability with such courses as how to prepare for a job interview, how to write a resume and more. There is ESL language development, short-term vocational training among others.

Their Commercial Driving Training Program has proven to be highly successful. An 8-week course, with 24 students in each class, now has an interest list of over 1,000 individuals from across the globe. The course is made up of three distinct classes.

The first is in the classroom with a simulator that takes students through such training as proper shifting and driving in different weather conditions such as snow. The second is in a

dedicated parking lot for the College, training drivers for their DMV



test. This class also teaches students how to pre-trip their vehicles correctly. Pre-trip includes checking the cab, air brake checks, in-cab instrument

checks and more. This is likewise tested at the DMV before the driver tests behind the wheel. In the parking lot, the class, students are also taught how to properly stop, back up, parallel parking and 90-degree parking. The third class covers road driving. The College currently has four vehicles of different sizes and gear differentials.

Another course coming soon to Victor Valley College's noncredit program is a cosmetology course. The class requires 1,000 hours of training before State testing takes place and will include a hair salon and nail/manicure salon. Members of the public will be invited in for free hair and nail services as a way for students to

Some courses take many weeks, while others, such as Forklift Certification, take only two days. Some classes will be offered on weekends too.

Other programs currently in session or coming soon to the campus include Emergency Telecommunications (911 Dispatch), Forklift Certification, Low Voltage Installation, Mobile Notary, Pharmacy Technician, Phlebotomy, Home Economics and more.

There are classes for older adults in development. Some of the classes will include art, personal finance, political science, creative writing, genealogy, photography, fashion, health, construction, automotive and computers.



Finally, other courses under consideration for the distant future include beer & wine making, Class C Driver's License, cell phone repair, vehicle wrap installer, veterinary assistant, manufacturing, industrial medicine and technical theater.
