This time we began with the opening of George Air Force Base and how this was the turning point not only in the growth of the Victor Valley, but in Jim Cox's career as well. After the city incorporated in 1962, a great recession hit the area, where the city was not able to borrow money to

grow as they needed. In fact, Victorville has seen a lot of economic ups and downs throughout the last 40 years, and it has not been easy for Jim, whether in his role as City Treasurer, City Manager or as a council

In the 70's while the economy continued its rise and fall, the City flourished as a few high profile movies were made here, as well as a new golf course. In the early 80's, the Victor Valley saw its greatest recession, but thanks in part to continued military spending and the increased activity at George Air Force Base, Victorville survived another downturn and actually had its best years during this period.

Unfortunately, in 1992, word came down that the Base was closing. **Jim Cox, Terry Caldwell** and others in our local government did everything they could to keep the base open, but in the end, it was shut down, and the valley was hit extremely hard.

Thankfully, due to the diligence and hard work for those who care about our area, we did survive and now the whole of the Victor Valley continues to grow and has become more than a retirement community, but home for a great many people.

Jim Cox has had a wonderful career and over his 30 years of service. It has kept him on his toes, and it seems, due to his ingenuity, he was able to manage by crisis, one after another, and become a High Desert icon.
