Things are looking up for the City of Victorville, thanks to Measure P. City Manager and Rotarian **Keith Metzler** was on hand this week to share some exciting updates about the measure. Going into using the additional finances from the measure, his team developed a new focus, to embrace the complaint; listen and appropriately respond to the needs to the community.

Measure P is a general sales tax measure approved by the Victorville voters during the November 3, 2020, election. This one-cent sales tax took effect on April 1, 2021, increasing Victorville's sales tax rate from 7.75 percent to 8.75 percent. Revenue generated by this general tax measure enables the City to increase safety for Victorville's growing population and expand essential services like police, fire, code compliance, animal care and control, library, and homelessness and housing.

FIRE: The Victorville Fire Department has been allocated almost 15 million from Measure P, and with those funds have been able to hire 30 additional

Now in its third year, here is a breakdown of the additional services and benefits it has brought.

personnel, purchase five new Type 1 Fire Engines and a Tiller Truck.

POLICE: The local Police Department has been given 15.5 million dollars which has assisted them in hiring 12

CODE ENFORCEMENT AND ANIMAL CONTROL:

Allocated with 7.6 million, they began a proactive campaign to listen to complaints with the intent to fix things that the community sees as issues. They have also adopted new pet adoption practices and are now operating 7 days a week.

COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENTS: With 4.8 million going to community improvements, the City has taken some old tennis courts and converted them to pickleball courts, resurfacing the Hook Community Gym and other improvements to West Winds Sports Center, Doris Davie's Pool, and more.

With additional money going to community services, the Victorville Library and the General Fund, a total of \$70,382,882 has gone back into the community, thanks to Measure P. The City is looking forward to new services for the community in 2024 and beyond.

Some of the new benefits include a new police station campus which is currently in the conceptual design phase. Construction of the new Victorville Library will begin this summer with over 17,000 square feet of services. The City of Victorville has secured a lease with the Victor Valley Union High School District for a new animal shelter at the former Goodwill High School. Finally, the City will purchase three transport capable squad vehicles to expand EMS services and are expected to be delivered by the end of the year.
