## HOW GOOD QUALITY SLEEP RELATES TO GOOD HEALTH

Do you have headaches in the morning, or high blood pressure? Do you have sleep "attacks" during the day even if you try to stay awake? Do you have lower energy than expected or fall asleep during social occasions? These are all indicators of sleep disorders, and there is help available. Rotary guest speaker Traci Marin enlightened a full crowd on the topic of good quality sleep. She is Victor Valley College's Program Director of Respiratory Therapy. Her Power Point presentation was interesting, and kept *most* Victorville Rotarians wide awake.

Adults require an average of 8.5 hours of sleep each night, but about half of Americans have interrupted sleep due to "disturbances", such as snoring. Snoring, we discovered, causes depression, memory problems, metabolic disturbances and cardiovascular disorders!

When we sleep, our body rests and restores its energy levels. Sleep is an active state that affects both our physical and mental well-being. A good night's sleep is often the best way to help us cope with stress, solve problems, or recover from illness.

"The prevalence of preventable and treatable disorders are increasing, even in our children! There is significant evidence to support the notion that simple lifestyle modifications can change this trend!" For more information, contact Traci at 760-887-2294.


### **Notes from Charles**
