Most people in the High Desert think that before SCLA (Southern California Logistics Airport) was George Air Force Base and that is it. But according to **Terry Caldwell**, it is much deeper than that, and there are many stories and people involved not many know of.



of the fortified islands in Manila Bay at the beginning of World War II. He died on April 29, 1942 in an aircraft accident near Darwin, NT Australia.

After WWII, the base was used to train fighter pilots and bombardiers, that participated in the Korean War, Vietnam, and others. The base was

also the first stop for Full Colonels to become Generals.

Sadly, in 1988 Congress adopted the "Base Realignment and Closure Act" and shockingly for all the base had done for American military victories, was in the first round of base closures! Terry, Congressman **Jerry Lewis** and others did all they could to save the base, but it was not to be.

The closing of the base had more impact than just on the military. It had a great economic impact on the High Desert and was a substantial loss all industries in our community. This writer's wife has told stories of her parents' Victorville tanning salon, which used to have a line out the door when the base was open, turned into an empty space after the closure.

In 1988, there was another battle of sorts for who would own the base. The fight was between Victorville and Adelanto, but soon, LA County wanted it too and use the 5,000 acres to move their homeless! Once again Congressman Lewis came to the rescue and said, "This will not happen!" True to his word, Victorville was awarded the base and it did not become an area for the LA homeless. Many people wanted the City to cut up the base for housing developments, but Terry and others had a dream to make George Air Force Base to be the premier air cargo hub in the Western Hemisphere. That dream is still being realized and is the driving force of the Southern California Logistics Airport today.

Before it was GAFB, the base was called the U.S. Army Air Corps Training Center. This was before Congress created the Air Force in 1941. The main training at the center was for bombing pilots and not just for Americans, our NATO Allies trained there too. In fact, the World War II Glider Pilots who participated in the Battle or

Normandy, trained in Victorville!



In the 1950's, the base became known as the Tactical Air Command and

later the Air Combat Command Center, when the base moved away from Bombing to Fighter Jets.

George Air Force Base was named in honor of Brig Gen Harold Huston George (1892–1942) on June 2, 1950. A World War I fighter ace, General George directed air operations in defense

looking forward to the next installment! I agree vehemently with what Terry shared when




he first began his talk; yes, it is great to be outdoors again and being at a "normal" Rotary meeting.
