Literacy Project

Brad Letner has a passion for education. He believes that education is a cure for poverty. With this mindset, Brad started the Literacy Project as part of our Community Service for this year. With the aide of a computer program, 3-4 year olds attend three sessions, Tuesday - Thursday from 2-3pm where after completion, they will be able to read at a 1st grade level by the time they start kindergarten.



The project was budgeted for 5 children, but on opening day, 18 families were waiting to get in! They have even had to send away 6 families because they just cannot fit any more in! This shows there is a need in the Victor Valley and our residents want to see filled!

The sad part, even after many pleas, Brad is still very low on volunteers! Margaret Cooker is there on most days and Chris Ackerman volunteers on Wednesdays. Even though this is Rotary project, Brad has been forced to go to the community to ask for volunteers due to the lack of Rotarians signing up to help out.

We all understand life is extremely busy and it is very hard to get away in the work week, but we ask that you do what you can to work your schedules to fit in 1 hour a week for these kids. The Rotary Literacy Project has the seeds to be a long standing success in the High Desert, but it will die and burn unless more Rotarians step up and help out.
