Despite being born premature with cerebral palsy, Tom will be walking in his 45th March of Dimes in May of this year.

Tom began his March of Dimes walks in 1976 at aged 13 and just 2 years later garnered both local

and national media attention. As a Senior in 1981, Tom raised more funds than the Mayor of Covina! The look of his March of Dimes walks has changed over his 45 years. They began at local pizza parlors, then Victor Valley Jr. High, and later City Hall, and pre-Covid, at Victor Valley College.

Since that time, he has amassed well over 500 miles and has brought quite a cast of characters with him along the way, most notably, the CHiPs family.

Known as "Tom's Team" actors **Robert Pine** and **Larry Wilcox**, known for their starring roles in the TV show "CHiPs" have stood by his side and become to represent Tom with the guarantee that if you walk in the March of Dimes with Tom's team, you are at
