"This is the World We Live In"



This week's program was our annual visit from Congressman Col. Paul Cook (Ret.). We hosted over 100 members and guests, including dignitaries and community leaders from Victorville, Apple Valley, Hesperia, Adelanto and more.

Paul Cook spoke from the heart today, and it was quite serious and solemn. Mr. Cook just returned from Tel Aviv, Israel, and after a 2.5 hour meeting with Israeli Prime Minister Netanyahu, Paul

had a lot on his mind. With the Congressman there on behalf of our government's Foreign Affairs Committee to view their "Missile Dome" and "David's Sling" defense strategies, Congressman Cook shared with the Rotary Club, the dangers on this region of the world, mainly the situation with the neighbor of Israel, Iran.

According to Paul Cook, Iran is now filling the void left behind by Iraq and Syria, and is in the process of obtaining nuclear capabilities. With that on the mind, Iran is also a region in support of Terrorist groups such as ISIS, Shiite Muslims, Al Qaeda and more. Iran has sworn to destroy the United States and plans to attack Europe as well.

Israel is now on the cutting edge of defense, because, according to the Congressman, "They have to be." They have experienced more missile attacks than any other region of the world, due to the fact that they are a Jewish state, surrounded by Islamic states; a very bad situation.

After speaking for quite a while about other parts of the world trying to get their hands on nuclear capabilities, the

Congressman declared it is time for the U.S. to band strongly with Israel, and to make right policy decisions that won't affect us, but will affect our children and grandchildren. He shared that this is serious business, more than politics, or which side if the aisle you sit on politically.

Congressman Paul Cook concluded his talk with a warning to all, "If you don't understand history, you're bound to repeat it".


RAFFLE SESSION:
