HELPING STUDENTS AND FAMILIES SUCCEED

The Adelanto Elementary School District (AESD) is a 15 campus TK-8th grade school district and serves students in the City of Adelanto (eight schools), in Northwest and South neighborhoods of the City of Victorville (five schools), and in the unincorporated community of El Mirage (County Service Area 70 - one school). Superintendent and Rotarian **Michael Krause**, along with Board Member **Christine Turner** spoke to the Club this week on the state of the district.

In 1941, the Adelanto School District was established to support the educational needs of the families from the newly opened George Air Force Base. The first schools were Harold H. George Elementary School and Harry R. Sheppard Middle School. Additional campuses were built around Adelanto starting with Adelanto Elementary School in the 1950s, as well as the former site of Adelanto Middle School (now demolished). Additional campuses were constructed in the population boom from the 1970-1990s.

Currently the district houses 7,800 students and 900 employees, and that number will no doubt be growing. There are 800 homes being built on the north side of Cobalt and Mojave, which will bring more students to the area, and the district is ready to take on the challenge.

What makes the district special is that they teach more than STEM, but STREM. They focus on the whole student in Science, Technology, Reading, Engineering, & Mathematics. Students are still behind due to doing class from home during 2020 and 2021,

and teachers are working hard with their students every day to bring them back up to grade level.

Another area that the AESD focuses on is the social emotional mental health of both the students and staff. Adelanto is an underserved community, and during Covid there was very little to do except sit at home, which has caused some social and emotional issues. The district addresses this by providing counselors and social workers to assist the students and staff to have a better day at school.

The third area of importance is engagement with the community, family and parents. Routinely the district invites parents and family members to connect on Zoom, which for this reason has proven to be quite a success, to be more engaged in the student's success.

Coming up down the road will be the return of the crown jewel of the City of Adelanto, their community pool. The district oversees the pool, and it is currently being redone. Years ago someone changed the water from fresh to salt, and combined with using the wrong chemicals, caused the whole pool to corrode. The pool is scheduled to reopen May 2024.
