## THE RETURN OF OLD TOWN GRIZ

The Griz is back!! For a third and final time, **Dave "Old Town Griz" Drylie** returned to share more images, stories and history of Hesperia. In his first two talks, Griz covered the years 1840 – 1900 and then 1900 – 1950. This week, Griz spoke about more recent history as well as the future for the Historical Society and Museum.

One of the first things Griz shared

was the recording from 1954 of FX McDonald and his song, "Headin for Hesperia", written by his dad to the tune of "Battle of the Hymn Republic". The song was viewed nationally on the Arthur Godfree Show, that caused the United States to recognize Hesperia more than just a place people moved to for the cleaner air to help with Tuberculosis.

In fact, for a 4 year period from 1955 - 1960, the population of Hesperia grew from around 600 people to over 5,000! It was the first of many real estate booms in the High Desert.

In 1957, the Hesperia Recreation and Park District began and it is the only such District of the "Big 3" (including Victorville and Apple Valley) that is not owned by the City. This is due to the fact that the District came before the City was incorporated in 1988.

From there Griz shared information on the building of Joshua Circle Elementary School and how the Bell in front of the school was from the first Hesperia schoolhouse. Originally it was to be called "Hesperia Elementary" until a contest was presented to the community to come up with a better name.

Other topics and points of interest shared included the Hesperia Inn,

and although since torn down, you can still see its look as Foremost Retirement Center was built the same way.

Griz also shared about Hesperia Lake, originally called Lake Rotobo) and the Hesperia Airpark, named that because people could literally fly out from in front of their homes. The Airpark also had a swimming pool in the shape of an airplane and apartments so people could fly in and play at Hesperia Golf Course, the only PGA course (for 4 years) ever in the High Desert.

Old Town Griz concluded his meeting sharing information on the Hesperia Historical Preservation Committee. They are currently looking for volunteer board members. They will be working to raise funds for the Museum to build scale models, a virtual resource library for area schools, and equipment for aerial photography, all to have the ability to show and demonstrate various aspects of Hesperia history and continue outreach to other public entities.

## Raffle


During this week's raffle President Steve Orr and Tina Escareño
