Highly Organized Terror

Born in Beirut, Kevork Kazanjian is of course very knowledgable in the area of the Middle East. As the Adjunct Faculty Undergraduate from CSUSB and Model United Nations Instructor at Victor Valley College, this region is also very personal too.

The terror group ISIS, is known in their homeland as IS, which stands for "Islamic State", which sees itself as just that, a fully functional State. And sadly, they are not far off.

After a an introduction from Ginger Ontiveros, Kevork began his presentation

with a history on how ISIS evolved from the fall of Sadam Hussein to what it has become today. After the Sadam regime was toppled, Syria was left alone and with no Allied troops there, ISIS was formed. What exactly is ISIS today? It is a fully functional executive branch of government with healthcare, education and more. At this moment Syria is in chaos and 7 groups are fighting for control and ISIS is winning at this time. In the last year 11,000 Westerners have joined them, in part due to the

fact that they are attracting very devout and religious people, who have a zeal for Religion. Where most of the Western world is moving into a more secular route, ISIS is moving into a long-term and stable religious organization.

Most shocking are the numbers ISIS is putting out in the form of a yearly Marketing and Business Report, for lack of a better term. This material is used for recruiting as well as a historical document for ISIS. In the 2013 Report they have some staggering figures: 15,000 troops on payroll, 1,000 assassinations in 2013, 10,000 operations in Iraq, 4,000 explosive devises planted and hundreds of non-Muslims "converted".

The assembled Rotary members were enthralled with the presentation and had numerous questions for Kevork. It was another heavy presentation, but one that needed to be heard, so as business leaders and Rotarians, we will have the knowledge to educate others on the true danger of ISIS.


