Other enhancements will be new and expanding lending capabilities with car, boat, motorcycle, RV and even snow mobile loans!

There will be expanded mortgage products set for the community with VA Loans, with some as low as 0% down, FHA Loans as low as 620 credit score and as little as 3.5% down, Construction Loans and Professional Loans that target market professionals such as doctors, dentists, attorneys, and CPA's.
