Education in the 21st Century

Rick Piercy's career in education has spanned the gamut, including his stint as a kindergarten teacher. His vast experience has culminated with over 25 years in developing the Lewis Center for Educational Research, a local charter school. His expertise in the field of education was reflected in an engaging presentation of education in America, taking a step back into the 19th century, when children's education was based on the "Three R's": Rigor, Relevance, and Relationships.

Educating American kids today is much different than the "assembly line" style of education in the 19th century. Rick tells us, "We are currently preparing students for jobs that don't yet exist, using technologies that haven't been invented, in order to solve problems we don't even know are problems yet." He warns that we have to create for our kids a world class education, or face the probability of becoming a third world nation. Grim prospect, unless we can compete with an educated work force.

Rick Piercy has strong high desert roots. He and his wife BOTH were born and raised in Victorville. David Leicht's two sons were the first students at the Lewis Center... AND three Victorville Rotarians serve on the Lewis Center Board: Kevin Porter, Robert Lovingood, and Russ Stringham. Thanks so much for the great presentation on how education has become what it is today.


