In the end a winner was selected and will compete at the District Level for a \$3,000 prize, but first we heard from the runner-up who received \$100.

Nataly Rezky describes herself as a Middle Eastern Christian who grew up in Egypt before coming to America. When she arrived she was faced with an ethical dilemma between what is acceptable in Egypt and what is acceptable in the United States. This challenged her in many



decisions from small to expansive. As she went to school she used ethics to find a middle ground and become a well rounded student. She will now move forward

in life knowing that ethics is more about the situation, circumstances and decisions we make, over the simple definition of right vs. wrong.

Taking home \$200 and representing the Club at the District Level is **Makayla Baldwin**. Like Nataly, Makayla is a Senior at Cobalt High School in Victorville. Makayla is a Battalion Commander, Brigade Commander and 10th Corps Deputy Commander in the California Cadet Corps, a school program that teaches students a multitude of skills such as leadership and responsibility that can be used in both military or the real world. Through this group she has developed a sense of honor and ethics that guides her life.

To Makayla, being ethical is putting the priorities of others first as well as others being well taken care of before your own needs. About a year ago, this was put to the test.

During her Junior year, she was leading a group of 12 cadets as they were gearing up for the X-treme Team Challenge with drills memorized and transportation arrangements made. A few weeks before the event, the bus that had been arranged to take the students canceled and there was no way to get to the event. The school had not placed at the event in many years but Makayla knew they had a great chance, if they could find a way to get there.
