San Bernardino is now the 6th largestgrowing city in the United States, and one look at the 10 and 15 freeway, you can see it for yourself. **Tim Watkins** from SANBAG gave the Rotary membership

details on the ongoing freeway projects, issues their facing and solutions for the future.

The 10 & 15 Fwy Corridor Project, that runs 33 miles from the Riverside County line to the beginning of Hwy 395, will be worked on for many years. One of the biggest challenges SANBAG faces is how to solve the issue of limited land and deceased funding.

There are a few choices on how to solve the traffic issues. 1. Do nothing. Even though that won't happen, it still is a choice nevertheless. 2. Just add more lanes to the freeways. The Federal Government will not allow this due to air quality laws. It is also a funding issue because adding more lanes would only be a 5 year solution. Within 5 years, the traffic would be back to where we are at now, due to the growing population. 3. Add carpool/HOV lanes. The Transportation Board only had funding to choose one freeway to put these lanes in, and they chose the 10 Fwy, and leaves the 15 in its current situation. Finally, choice





4, to add Express lanes. These is the best choice as it will free up traffic and will allow them to manage traffic performance better.

What can the public do? Continue to gripe about the traffic? SANBAG reminds us there is more to all of this than heavy traffic jams. One way is to represent your community on their I-10/I-15 Community Advisory Group (CAG), and work with SANBAG and share your voice on your community's challenges and possible solutions. Another way to help is to become well informed. Take time to learn, read through their materials, become part of their Social Media channels, and be better educated on the best way to relieve traffic many years to come.
