

Buying a House on Amazon

This week we got to hear from Honorary Rotarian **Caroll Yule** from Shear Realty and instead of sharing about the median home prices in the High Desert, she told us what is actually happening in the market in terms of home buying, and it's not too good for Realtors.

What has changed? Companies like Zillow, Purple Bricks and Redfin, have transformed the home buying process to the same equivalent of buying a book on Amazon. You put in the price you are willing to pay for a house, and if accepted, it's



yours. Easy and simple right? You'd be surprised.

This change began to happen due to economic challenges we have faced in California. Back in 1985, the High Desert was a

Last year on the High Desert MLS (HDAOR) non-members (Realtors from out of the area) sales on homes here exceeded \$500,000,000! This has happened because there are so many Realtors in California. The State consists of 184,000 agents, and 101,000 Brokers, which means that there are a lot of Realtors looking for money! On top of that the median home prices are up throughout the State, but here in the Victor Valley, the home prices are still lower which makes them easier to sell, so agents are coming far and wide to get the "easy money".

Nowadays, what a lot of sellers don't know is that their home is listed everywhere on the Internet! If you list with a local agent you will be on thousands of sites, and this was all done for free 10-15 years ago on Zillow as a database site to get a seller's home on different web pages. Now Zillow charges Realtors for their listings and top agents are having to pay up to \$2,000 a month to get their clients homes on the Internet. The worst part is that 3 out of 4 buyers are now looking for a home on these sites and their estimating systems are inaccurate with wrong information, according to Caroll. What make it even worse, is that although Zillow swears they are not a Real Estate Broker, they now provide instant offers for the sellers, which takes out a true and knowledgeable Real Estate Agents.

Realtors are ready to go into battle. This "do it yourself approach" mindset consumers have bought into needs to change and to do that in the Real Estate Market, Agents are going to provide excellent service, embrace technology and remind clients that nothing beats a working with a real person.
