Mojave Water Agency - Our Cups Are Half Full



Kirby Brill, General Manager of the Mojave Water Agency (MWA), spoke to us about 18 months ago and continues to bring interesting information for all. Today, Kirby reviewed some underlying pressures and the agency's position in mitigating these potential problems.

Projects are based on an assessment of the water basin

content (or aquifer) and imported water.

MWA has already assessed ground water basin resources which balanced natural supplies with demands. The other key part in the assessment is projecting water demands for at least 25 years, given in five year blocks. (The State only requires a 20 year projection.)

Based on data available, here are some interesting estimates:

Average Growth Rate: 2.5%

Area: Currently 340,000 growing to 570,000 by 2035

Gallons per capita/day: 284 in 2000 down to 190 today

A State requirement was instituted last year for 214 gallons per capita per day be met by 2020. MWA has already met that goal! And Kirby tells us that MWA is still at 2000 production – even though our population has seen an increase from 2000-2010 of almost 40%!

MWA will continue to need imported water in order to augment ground water supply and keep water supply and demand in balance.



Gary Martin led us on a tour of MWA's nearly-completed new facility. This project has seen an economy up-side with approximately 45% savings on construction costs. MWA is pursuing Gold Certification for their "Green" building and Gary pointed out how the outside landscaping wasn't just beautiful but demonstrates water efficiency. MWA also has the ability to capture store storm water in 4 ponds at this site. The inside will have the latest technology and a 50% growth capability.
