Melda Gaskins, is the principal of a very special school here in the High Desert, the Cobalt Institute of Math and Science. The institute is a S.T.E.M. School which stands for Science, Technology, Engineering and Math. CIMS is a small middle and high school that includes grades 7 through 12. The mission of CIMS is to offer an academic program in a smaller learning environment that promotes high expectations for all students to reach for their full potential in a high tech society. The design of the school is to provide a rigorous and creative core education in the S.T.E.M. areas of learning.

Their goals are to prepare students for college as well as careers that will focus on engineering, technology and the bio-technical sciences. They strive for their students to be well above average in core subjects and to be critical thinkers, problem solvers, and leaders in their communities.

CIMS achieves these goals by the faculty creating pathways in technology, bio-medical and engineering sciences for students to learn. Teachers are highly trained through Project Lead the Way courses that develop intense integrated and project based curriculum.

The Institute goes further than its own staff. It reaches out for partnerships with businesses and community leaders in areas of scholarships, job shadowing, guest speakers, career days, fundraising and of course, donations.
