country, make sure your cell service has roaming available, take screenshots of any maps in case your cell service drops, and be aware of scams, such as people "stranded" on the side of the road and wanting you to stop.

While in San Felipe, Jeff and his wife have met up with the Rotary Club of San Felipe, which have their meetings on Monday mornings. The Club, which began in 2001, does many great fundraisers that raise money for the community such as their Tamale Festival. The Club buys all the ingredients, and the locals make them and the Club in return sells them and all the profits go to helping those less fortunate in the community.

Another very popular event is their breakfast trailer every Saturday morning at the San Felipe Farmers' Market, where they raise money by selling biscuits and gravy to the shoppers. They also raise funds to pay for schooling for children in the community, because free education ends after the 6th grade, and many cannot afford to pay for further schooling. This is just a small example of the great work done by this Club.
