Crimes and Misdemeanors

The rapid usage of marijuana began with the passing of Prop 215, which allowed medical marijuana usage and dispensaries to become legal. The Dispensaries are only supposed to sell to someone with a Medical Marijuana Card or if you are a Caregiver for another. But with most things, this has lead to more problems than solutions. Dispensaries are being closed down at a rapid rate due to "under the Table" dealings, which has now lead onto more crimes. I present you with the story of Sandra.

Sandra loves her weed. She doesn't have a Medical Card, so to get her pot illegally, her neighborhood dispensary will take care of her at the back door. To get money to do this she has to do a little shoplifting. With the passing of AB 109 she knows that as long as she steals no more than \$949 worth of stuff, then she will only be charged with a misdemeanor, if she gets caught at all. Sandra knows that even though AB109 was sold as a way to help victims, and use tax dollars and put them towards going after true dangerous and violent criminals, was actually just a way for the State to deal with prison overpopulation.



Sandra knows the score all too well. To deal with the overcrowding issue, California now takes the non-violent inmates from State Prisons, and moves them to County Jails, which were meant to serve inmates for under a 1 year stay. The issue is solved on the State level, but now the County is overpopulated! She knows to solve this, the County System has no choice but to release misdemeanor cases rather quickly!

Sandra has her game all worked out. She knows that if she steals \$950 or more in merchandise she will be charged with a felony, so as long as she stays under that amount, she can sell the merchandise off, and get money for her dope. If she gets caught, who cares! Even though she may receive a 3 year jail term, she knows she will only see a couple months, if not less, because the state needs to make sure that the felons in County, do not become burdened with overcrowding.

It's a win-win for Sandra! The only loser is the High Desert business that has lost \$900 of product, loss in revenue and income to feed their families and the families of their employees, all because it makes Sandra feel good and relaxed when she gets high. Next time someone tells you that we should legalize marijuana, that no one suffers from it, share this story with them.
